- The hummingbirds are back in San Antonio. Plant cross vine, salvia, zinnias, firebush, and cape honeysuckle to provide nectar. Bring the birds in for close observation with a sugar water feeder hanging on your eaves or trellis. Mix one-part sugar with four parts water by volume.
- Bedstraw and beggar's lice are two weeds producing seeds now that stick to pets. Use a rake to
 collect the bedstraw. Hand pull or cut beggar's lice with a string mower. Both can go in the
 compost pile.
- For cut flowers this summer plant zinnias in a raised bed in full sun. The showy flowers are also a
 favorite nectar source for hummingbirds and butterflies. Seed-eating birds will eat the seeds if
 you allow them to mature. Use Dreamland transplants or plant California Giant and Cactus
 zinnias by seed.
- Plant tomato and pepper transplants in the vegetable garden. Plant green beans, cucumbers, cantaloupe, and squash by seed. Use tatuma squash seed if you have had trouble with squash vine borers.
