



CITRUS TREES 2016

GRAPEFRUIT



BLOOMSWEET- White fleshed fruit with yellow skin, easy to peel, cold hardy.

RUBY RED- The pink-red flesh has a sweet flavor with a hint of tartness. Ripens November-May

LEMONS



LEMON FROST- Vigorous spreading tree, bears multiple crops a year.

PONDEROSA- Small tree, fruit is extra-large with a thick ring. It is very prolific.

IMPROVED MEYERS- Compact tree, medium to large, thin yellow/orange skin, fruit is very juicy.

LIME



KAFFIR- grown for unique aromatic leaves used in Asian cooking.

KEY LIME- Small tree, fruit is thin skinned with a few seeds.

MEXICAN LIME- Thorny, small tree, heavy bearer of very aromatic, juicy, acidic fruit.

OTHER ORANGES



NULES CLEMENTINE- Can be grown as a patio tree. Known for its easy to peel skin and small fruit. High quality fruit with thin rind.

MARRS- Navel orange budsport, low in acid and bears heavily

MORO BLOOD- most colorful of the blood oranges, with a deep red flesh and a rind that has a bright red blush. The flavor is stronger and the aroma is more intense than a normal orange. This fruit has a distinct, sweet flavor with a hint of raspberry. The fruit is smaller than an average orange; its skin is usually pitted, but can be smooth.

SATSUMA

ARCTIC FROST- This small, spreading evergreen tree is slightly more cold tolerant than the other varieties. Can tolerate 10 °F and grows 8-12' in ground and 6' in a container.



BUMPER- This fruit tree produces more fruit per square foot than other varieties of Satsuma, can withstand temperatures down to 15 °F, and grows 10-12' tall in the ground and 5-7' in a container. Juicy, nearly-seedless and easy-to-peel fruit ripens in winter, heavy producer.

DOBASHI BENI- Limbsport of Owari, fruit is deep orange/reddish in color, good quality, ripens in November

KIMBROUGH- LSU introduction, thought to be 1-2 degrees more hardy than Owari. Large fruit that is easy to peel.

MIHO- Cold hardy, sweet and seedless. Ripens late September to early October.

OKITSU WASE- Seedless with great flavor, very prolific.

OWARI- Cold hardy with a medium sized fruit, seedless, ripens mid to late October.

ORANGE FROST- These small, spreading evergreen trees are cold tolerant to 15 °F and grow 8-12' in the ground and 6' in a container. Juicy, delicious, nearly-seedless and easy-peeling fruit and it is also on its own root system.

SETO- Large fruit with red/orange skin and orange flesh. Fruit ripens in October.

SILVERHILL- Distinctly more cold hardy than most satsumas. The sweet fruit keeps well on the tree.

XIE SHAN- Early ripening variety, rich and sweet flavor, more up right growing habit than other satsumas.

Protect citrus below 25°
Cold tolerance for citrus describes conditions above 20°
