



# GRAPES & BERRIES 2016

## BLACKBERRIES

**ARAPAHO THORNLESS** – It is very disease resistant, productive and sweet. Does not need support. Ripens mid to late season. (400-500 hrs.)

**APACHE** – Apache is a very productive blackberry. Fruit is blocky, conical, and very attractive with a glossy, black finish. Good flavor berry and would be excellent for home gardeners. Ripens mid to very late season. Outstanding berry! (500-800 hrs.)

**BRAZOS** – It is a large, attractive, and fairly firm blackberry, with a tart flavor. It is an upright grower that is productive and resistant to diseases. Standard in Texas. High yields of fruit that ripens mid to late May. Good for cooking and canning.

**KIOWA** – One of the largest of all blackberries with a very high yield and great flavor. Ripens early season. Flavorful! (200 hrs.)

**OUACHITA** – Thornless plump pickable berries. Disease resistant medium sized fruit. (300-500 hrs.)

**NATCHEZ** – Very productive, thornless variety with great flavor. (500 hrs.)



## BLUEBERRIES

**CLIMAX** – Is a new rabbiteye blueberry, which is early ripening. Most of the fruit ripens in a short period of time. The crop load is moderate to high. (310-420 hrs.)

**PREMIERE** – Excellent color, size, and flavor. Vigorous and productive bushes. Ripens late May to early June. (550 hrs.)

**TIFBLUE** – Has long been considered the best blueberry available. This early to mid-season variety has all the right qualities: beautiful appearance, high productivity and has the most excellent flavor making it the number one selection for home owners. Ripens mid to late season. (550-650 hrs.)



## RASPBERRIES

**DORMAN RED** – Is vigorous and productive raspberry bush. Is an ever-bearing, with harvesting beginning in June and lasting until frost.

**HERITAGE RASPBERRY** - Primocane. Large, sweet, dark red berries that are good for fresh eating, canning, freezing, or making jams. Self-supporting. Everbearing. Ripens in September through frost. Self-pollinating. (250 hrs.)



## GRAPES

**BLACK SPANISH** – This grape has large, compact clusters with small black, seeded berries. Good for wine, juice, or grape jelly. Very high yielding. The fruit ripens in late July or early August.

**BLANC DU BOIS** – Developed as a white table grape and for wine production. Also great for juices and jellies. Large clusters of white (light green) grapes. Ripens in July. Vigorous vine. Shows to be tolerant to Pierce's Disease. Self-fertile.

**CHAMPANEL** – Very resistant to heat and drought with a good Pierce disease resistance. Large black grape that has strong thin skin with tender, juicy inside. Adapts well in any soil, including alkaline and black soils. Large loose clusters of grapes that ripen in early July.
